APRIL 1st - BURNING PERMITS

Anyone wishing to burn must drop by the Municipal Office during regular office hours to pick up their burning permit.

Permit fees will be as follows:

\$10.00 - yearly

\$2.00 - two weeks

\$20.00 - day burning (special permit that has to be authorized by the Fire Chief)

No day burning still applies.

Please phone the Fire Dept., as per your permit, prior to any burning, to determine if there are any fire restrictions.

Remember burning without a permit, will result in a fine.

NOTICE TO TRUCKERS HALF LOAD RESTRICTIONS

Reduced loading begins March 25

PRINCE TOWNSHIP BUILDING PERMITS

All permit applications are handled by the City of Sault Ste. Marie Building Dept. Civic Centre, Level 5, 99 Foster Drive, Sault Ste Marie, ON P6A 5X6

Building Permits

Permits ensure that construction within the municipality meets with standards set out in the Ontario Building Code. No matter what the specific project may be, the enforcement of codes is carried out to protect public health, safety and welfare. Compliance with municipal by-laws such as the Zoning By-law is also evaluated during the review process.

Building permits are typically required for the following:

- New buildings
- Additions
- Renovations or alterations
- Demolitions
- Prefabricated structures
- HVAC systems (heating, ventilation, air conditioning)

- Miscellaneous for residential (pools, fireplaces, decks, fences, etc.)
- Temporary buildings
- Installing new windows and exterior doors
- Installing new shingles or metal roofing
- Installing new cladding (siding, stucco, etc.)

To be sure, contact the Building Division at 705-759-5398 or email building@cityssm.on.ca, describe the work to be done and investigate what the requirements are.

If your questions cannot be answered over the phone or email, you can show your proposal to the Building Division staff at the Civic Centre - Level 5. They are always ready and willing to help!



POSTAL DELIVERY / 911 SIGNS

Property owners are reminded to keep mail boxes (including green boxes) clear of trees and other obstacles in order to receive uninterrupted mail delivery.

In addition, 911 numbers should be kept clear of trees so that they are visible by emergency vehicles. The sign should be visible by emergency personnel from 100ft.

If only it were that quick!

The Township is expecting to hire 2 students this summer for our roads crew. If you are interested in working for the municipality this summer, see this newsletter for our ad, or submit your résumé to the office, expressing your interest.

As well, the Library, Museum and the EarlyOn Child and Family Centre will also be looking for one student each. If you are applying in the office, please indicate if you want your résumé redirected to one of these areas.

Prince Township got a pleasant surprise when the Province announced unconditional one-time funding of \$247,400 this year. There are several projects underway, including improvements to Walls Rd,

Base Line and Town Line, as well as some needs for the Community Hall and the Pavilion. Council will be deciding during budget deliberations on May 28th how this money will be spent. 405 small and rural municipalities are receiving this funding from the Ontario government.

Council will be entering into an agreement with SSM Fire Service to assure that the Township has coverage during weekday hours when our volunteers are often not available. As per our departments operating guide lines, the response will be external only. It is imperative that you have an escape route planned, should you have a fire. Council also decided to enter a new agreement with the City and SSM Police Services, after the Police Chief, with the approval of the SSM Police Services Board, approached the Township with a more favourable agreement than the previous one.

Although National Volunteer week is April 7th to April 13th, Council will be hosting its annual Volunteer Dinner on Monday, April 15th. If you volunteered in 2018 in any capacity for the township, watch for your invitation. Emergency Preparedness Starts With You

Family Emergency Kit

During an emergency you may have no electrical power or be asked to evacuate. An emergency kit contains essential items you and your family need to survive on your own for at least 72 hours. Keep a kit at home, work and in your car. Your kit should be easy to carry and portable such as a knapsack or suitcase. Check the contents twice a year to ensure the freshness of food and water, and refresh items if needed.

KIT ESSENTIALS:

- Non-perishable food
- Prescription medication
- Manual can opener
- Bottled water (4L per person, per day)
- Flashlight, glow stick
- Radio (w/batteries) or crank radio
- First-aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Cell phone with chargers and backup battery
- Clothing, footwear, blankets or sleeping bags
- Moist towelettes, hand sanitizers and garbage bags for personal sanitation
- Extra keys and cash
- Copies of important papers (identification, insurance)
