
Note: the fee is \$20 for the season.

PRINCE TOWNSHIP BUILDING PERMITS

All permit applications are handled by the City of Sault Ste. Marie Building Dept. Civic Centre, Level 5, 99 Foster Drive, Sault Ste Marie, ON P6A 5X6

Building Permits

Permits ensure that construction within the municipality meets with standards set out in the Ontario Building Code. No matter what the specific project may be, the enforcement of codes is carried out to protect public health, safety, and welfare. Compliance with municipal by-laws such as the Zoning By-law is also evaluated during the review process.

Building permits are typically required for the following:

- New buildings
- Additions
- Renovations or alterations
- Demolitions
- Prefabricated structures
- HVAC systems (heating, ventilation, air conditioning)
- Miscellaneous for residential (pools, fireplaces, decks, fences, etc.)
- Temporary buildings
- Installing new windows and exterior doors
- Installing new shingles or metal roofing
- Installing new cladding (siding, stucco, etc.)

To be sure, contact the Building Division at 705-759-5398 or email building@cityssm.on.ca, describe the work to be done and investigate what the requirements are. If your questions cannot be answered over the phone or email, you can show your proposal to the Building Division

staff at the Civic Centre - Level 5. They are always ready and willing to help!

Report Speeding

Online reporting with eth OPP can be done by going to oop.ca on the internet and choosing the link "Report online". The link is in the top right corner of the main page. It is also listed under "Popular" on the main page. There are step by step instructions on how to complete the online reporting. This tool allows people to report minor occurrences such as thefts, mischiefs, lost property and driving complaints that occurred in areas where the OPP police.
