UNION GAS UPDATE

Union Gas is continuing to construct gas service in Prince Township and making good progress. It is expected that all gas mains will be installed by approximately September 1, 2018. For those new customers who have completed the full sign-up process, our contractor has begun the process of reaching out to initiate the connection process. If you have not been contacted yet, you will be shortly.

If you want to switch to natural gas before the end of the 2018 Union Gas must have your new customer account created and a completed application from your heating contractor (HVAC) by September 1, 2018. For any applications received after September 1, 2018, Union Gas will endeavor to provide service before the end of 2018 but it may be weather

dependent and cannot be guaranteed. To avoid delays in starting to save, we encourage you to work with your heating contractor to act as quickly as possible!

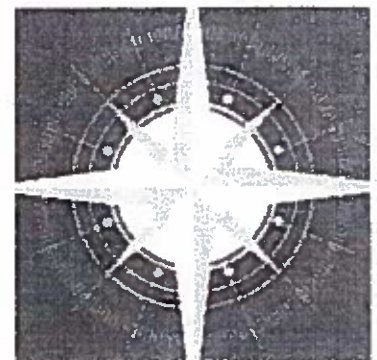

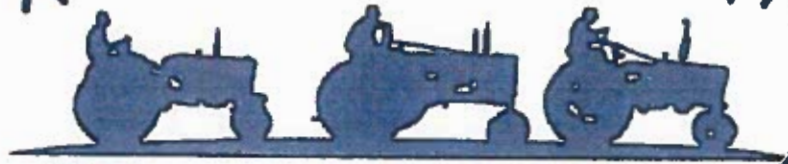
