

MUNICIPALITY OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PRINCE.

BY-LAW NO. 290 ?

WHEREAS it has been made to appear that many persons have created a nuisance upon the Highways of the Township of Prince by depositing and leaving on such Highways, dirt, filth, glass, bottles, cans, handbills, paper and rubbish and refuse, or the carcass of any animal :

AND WHEREAS by RSO Chapter 243, Section 486, authority and power to pass this By-Law is given to the Municipal Council.

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Township of Prince enacts as follows:

- (1) No person shall throw, place or deposit on any Highway or Bridge within the limits of the said Township of Prince, any dirt, filth, glass, bottles, cans, handbills, paper or other rubbish or refuse, or the carcass of any animal, and any articles that are discarded and so thrown shall be considered by the discarding of rubbish or refuse within the purport of this By-Law.
- (2) Any person who contravenes the terms of this By-Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall, upon conviction thereof before a Police Magistrate, be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50.00 together with costs, and in default of payment, such offender may be committed to the Common Jail for a period not exceeding two months.
- (3) It is the purpose and intent of the Council of the Township of Prince that this By-Law shall apply to private property in the said Township of Prince as well as Highways and Bridges, because the Township has already provided a dumping place for such rubbish and refuse.
- (4) This By-Law shall take effect and come into effect on the passing thereof.
