### HOLIDAY GARBAGE

### Arrears Notices

To save tax dollars, we are only mailing arrears notices out four times a year. They are mailed out September, November, March and June. These are the months after the tax bill due dates (February, May, August and October).

### BUILDING PERMITS

Please remember that building permits are required for re-shingling, new windows & doors, siding, fences etc., as well as houses, any interior structural changes, garages, and accessory buildings.

### ATTENTION!

#### Recycling at the Community Centre

The carts at the back of the Municipal Building are **ONLY** for those residences that do not have curb-side collection. We do not have enough carts at the back of the Municipal Building to accommodate everyone. We have installed a video camera to ensure compliance. If you have been provided with a cart, you **MUST** use it at your residence.

**PLEASE NOTE:** We no longer take cardboard at the Community Centre. Please put your cardboard out with your carts. If you have too much cardboard for your cart, bundle it up in 2' x 2' x 1' bundles and place next to your recycling cart at the end of your driveway.

It is **imperative** that the recycling carts, **both here and at home**, are sorted properly, according to the instructions on the lid of the container. If the recycling is not sorted the bin will be rejected.

**It seems like this was one of the best summers in this area in a very long time.**

There will be no election for Council in October as all of the current members of Council were acclaimed. Your 2018 to 2022 council is as follows: Mayor: Kenneth Lamming, Councillors: David Amadio, Ian Chambers, Michael Matthews and Enzo Palumbo.

There will be an election for the English Public, English Separate, and French Public school boards.

The French Separate school board trustee was acclaimed. Voting will take place in the Community

Hall of the Township on Monday, October 22<sup>nd</sup>, from 10 am until 8 pm. On Wednesday, October 10<sup>th</sup>, there will be an advance poll in the municipal office from 10 am until 8 pm. Are you on the Voters' List for the 2018 Municipal

The work on the Walls Road culvert is nearly completed. The township has applied for funding to rehabilitate the rest of Walls Road during the 2019 construction season.

The Prince Lake Road project has been completed, making the entrance hill and curves safer. The project was possible through funding by the Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund – Top-up Funding program.

The Festival and Events Pavilion has been the site for a Vendors' market this summer. It will continue into October. Thank you to FedNor and Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation for their generosity, which helped to make this structure possible.

The township, in conjunction and through the generosity of the TransCanada Trail, will be burying a time capsule at the Gros Cap Marina Park on September 19<sup>th</sup> at 1 p.m. If you have something that you think should be included in the capsule, please contact the office or bring it to us prior to September 14<sup>th</sup>. You are invited to join us for this historical event.

The Association of Municipalities of Ontario, through the Mainstreet Revitalization project, has provided funding which will allow us to install hands-free accessible doors at both entrances to the municipal building. This will make it much easier for anyone with physical limitations and for parents with toddlers and babies to enter. We expect that the new doors will be installed within the next month.

The natural gas project has been moving forward quickly and several residences have already been connected. Please continue to be aware of the workers doing the installation as you pass them on our roads.

The third instalment of taxes was due on August 15<sup>th</sup> and the final instalment will be due on October 15<sup>th</sup>. Interest is calculated on the first day of each month on any unpaid principal balance. If you have any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to contact the office.

Thank you to Liam and Evan for their hard work this summer on our roads crew. Thank you to Canada Summer Jobs, who once again helped us with funding. We wish all of our summer students continued goo

**Taking the School Bus**

**How to prepare your child for the  
school bus**

Most mishaps take place outside the bus, so here are some precautions you can take:

- Don't let your children arrive at the stop too early. They may be tempted to wander or get into mischief.
- Make sure they know what to do if they miss the bus: come back home; or if at school, report to a teacher – and never, never accept a ride from a stranger.
- If the stop is a long way from home, plan and discuss with your children where they can go in an emergency.
- If it is dark on the way to or from the bus, make your children visible. Use retro-reflective tape on their clothing and avoid dark colors.
- Make sure they wait well away from the roadway, and stay well back until the bus has come to a full stop and the door opens.
- Explain they must walk at least three metres (10 feet) away when crossing in front of the bus so the driver can see them.
- Forbid running, pushing and horseplay!
- Tell your children to come straight home from the bus no detours.

## POWER OUTAGE SAFETY TIPS



To reduce the risk of fire during a power outage, the Prince Township Volunteer Fire Department has the following safety tips for our residents:

- **Make sure your home has battery-operated smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms.** Electrically-connected smoke and carbon monoxide alarms will not work when the power is out unless they have battery back-ups.
- **Develop and practice your Home Fire Escape Plan.** Make sure everyone understands the sound of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and knows what to do when a fire occurs.
- **Use flashlights or battery-operated lanterns instead of candles or hurricane lamps.** If using candles, place them in a secure holder and cover them with a glass chimney, away from children and pets.
- **Propane and charcoal barbecues are for outdoor use only.** Do not bring them inside.
- **Purchase generators with recognized, approved labels.** Make sure the unit has proper connection receptacles and circuit breakers.
- **Portable generators should only be used outdoors and carefully located so that exhaust fumes do not enter the home.** Allow the generator to cool before refueling and ensure that refueling takes place outdoors, following manufacturer's instructions. Store fuel outside the home in approved containers.

- **Use only portable space heaters that have been designed for indoor use and follow the manufacturer's instructions.**
- **Make sure electric stove elements and small appliances are OFF or unplugged** to prevent fires from occurring when the electricity is restored.
- **Cordless phones will not work when the power is out**, so have at least one phone that does not require electricity to operate.
- **Use extreme caution during flood emergencies and power outages.** Electrical equipment impacted by flood water can be extremely dangerous. For more important information about electrical safety during floods, please visit the [Electrical Safety Authority](#) website.

### BURNING PERMITS

- Anyone wishing to burn must drop by the Municipal Office during regular hours to pick up your burning permit.
- Permit fees will be as follows:
  - \$10.00 - yearly
  - \$2.00 - two weeks
  - \$20.00 - day burning (special permit that has to be authorized by the Fire Chief)
- **No day burning still applies.**
- Please phone the Fire Dept., as per your permit, prior to any burning, to determine if there are any fire restrictions.

**Remember burning without a permit, will result in a fine.**

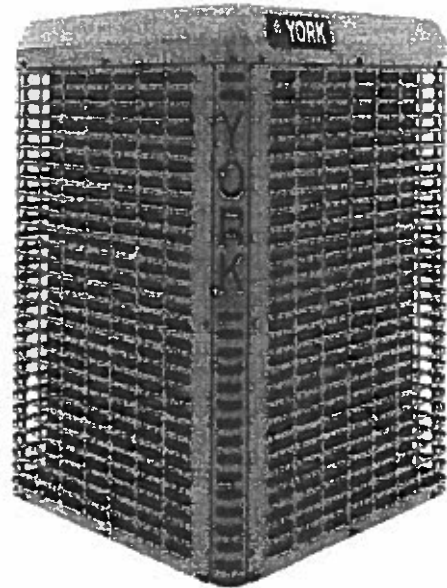

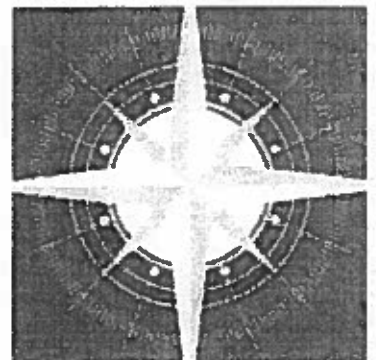
